



Course Title: Government / Economics

Description:

Government (*0.5 high school credit*): Fall Tuesdays OR Spring Thursdays

Government - The United States' government allows her citizens the "unalienable rights" of "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness"—and America depends on educated citizens who understand their rights and responsibilities. This important study of American government teaches the student the firm Christian foundation upon which the United States was built. In addition, the detailed presentation of the Constitution and Bill of Rights shows the emphasis on limited government that was intended by the Founding Fathers. This class will rely heavily on supplemental material. Students will read Federalist Papers, Supreme Court decisions, and various articles.

Economics (*0.5 high school credit*): Fall Thursdays OR Spring Tuesdays

This course explains the economic principles of production, supply and demand, competition, inflation, and saving. Students will examine the link between economic, political, and individual freedom.
