



Course Title: Humanities 1

Description:

The humanities series of classes are designed to give students the opportunity to study and discuss world history with a biblical worldview. This class will allow students to experience ancient biblical history through literature, geography, and the arts. Intended to meet the requirements for elementary social studies as well as literature, this course integrates various activities, projects, and subjects to help His-story come to life! The humanities courses will explore civilization throughout the entire span of human history with the acclaimed Mystery of History series of texts.

Beginning with Humanities 1, students will begin their studies of history, Bible, and world geography with Creation and end with the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The tutor will rely heavily on hands-on activities and class projects to engage students and impart a love of learning and HIS-story. The in-class instruction and discussions are designed to help students recognize valuable lessons through the study of mankind's successes and failures. Along the way students will engage with literature that will bring the ancient world alive, and travel back in time to survey the music, art, and religions of ancient civilizations. Students will begin to become more independent learners as they complete the at-home portion of their weekly assignments and readings. The objective of this course is for students to see the hand of God in ancient history and to identify the need of Christ in all people, in all nations, throughout time.
