



Course Title: Composition & British Literature

Description:

This course is designed for students in the 10<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grades. Students will develop and practice critical thinking skills by analyzing classic British literature, including themes, history, vocabulary, symbolism, and literary devices. We will cover favorite selections such as Macbeth, Frankenstein, the works of Arthur Conan Doyle, C.S. Lewis, and others in depth for a well-rounded English credit. The writing focus will be on crafting and improving critical thinking communication through relatable writing exercises to gently guide reluctant writers and engage enthusiastic writers. Writing exercises include but are not limited to academic essays, newspaper articles, scripts, short stories, infographics, etc. Students will receive specific feedback on improving their writing skills throughout the year to give students confidence that they CAN write. This unique option is the equivalent of 1 high school English credit.

A basic knowledge of grammar is necessary to participate in this course.
