Thank you, Bellevue family, for your faithful giving! Our current giving through the first of February is 1.7% above giving from this same time last year with budget expenditures at their budgeted levels. For the past three years we have kept the budget steady at \$26,000,000; however, with inflation, the expenses of the church have continued to increase. Considering these factors, the Finance Committee, upon the recommendation of the Budget Advisory Group, has approved increasing the budget to \$26,500,000 for the 2025-2026 budget year with additional changes in the allocation of the budget dollars.

The presented budget has three significant changes intended to update the budget focus to match our church's vision and mission.

College Ministry

We will increase funding for this ministry to relocate The Vue to its former location, in a building near the University of Memphis. A different church has been meeting in that building on a month-tomonth basis since The Vue moved out, but they have now purchased their own permanent meeting space. Therefore, College Ministry has the opportunity to move back into the space that was originally designed for The Vue. The building has not been altered since we left except for technology upgrades to keep the electronics up to date.

Bella Vista

We will have a \$328,000 budget reduction by transitioning the Bella Vista congregation, which is currently meeting on Highland Street, to the Appling campus. Bella Vista's congregation has been decreasing (annual worship

attendance has dropped from a high of 312 to 238, and baptisms have dropped from a high of 25 to 1 this past year) while the Hispanic congregation at our Appling campus has been increasing (in 2024 there were 77 new members and 45 baptisms). The Hispanic population in the Cordova area has been increasing, and our Hispanic Life Groups are very active and growing. As we shift ministry efforts to our Appling campus, we are grateful for Pastor Mario Maldonado and his 24 years of faithful service to Bella Vista, in addition to all the other staff members who have dedicated their lives to serving the Hispanic community. We look forward to continuing this work at the Appling campus.

Southern Baptist Convention (SBC)

Bellevue has always been a strong supporter of the SBC, with Bro. Steve serving two terms as president of the convention as well as our previous three Senior Pastors. The Tennessee Baptist Mission Board (TBMB), at its most recent convention, reduced the percentage of Cooperative Program money we have been sending through them to the SBC and its agencies from 47.5% to 40%, with 5% of the decrease going directly to the International Mission Board (IMB). We have made the decision to reduce the amount we send through the TBMB from \$800,000 to \$300,000 and instead send funds directly to the IMB (international missionaries) and North American Mission Board (NAMB) (primarily church planters in the United States). We will have a missions emphasis in this year's Love Offering, as we have had in years past, to directly fund our SBC missionaries, church planters, and other SBC agencies as needed. Bellevue's support of SBC missions efforts, local ministries, and national and international missions partners through Love Offerings has totaled \$5.6 million over the past four years. Bellevue has been blessed with significant responses to the Love Offerings over the past several years. This allows the church to support missions efforts around the world, minister to our local community, and better equip our facility here in Cordova to minister with new larger assembly areas for Next Gen Ministry.

There is also additional funding for missions coming from both the World Missions Offering and the Bellevue Foundation.

The proposed 2025–2026 budget includes several open positions and salary increases for our employees. Several of the open positions are difficult to fill and most likely will not be filled until we have a new Pastor. Even with these openings, our dedicated staff are filling the gaps and carrying on with ministry excellence.

Local Total

Total Love Offering Giving Going to Missions

Medical costs to the church in this year's budget have increased by \$110,000 while the utilities cost over many years has held to a little over \$1,000,000. Kevin Halev, Facility and Grounds Administrator, and Matt Ervin, Energy Management Supervisor, have worked to complete many energy-saving initiatives such as switching out lighting to lower cost fixtures, putting all the HVAC on an electronic management system, and replacing HVAC units that have reached their useful life limit with more energy-efficient units. With the building scheduling system, we now set cooling or heat to come on automatically when the room is scheduled for use. All these efforts have collectively worked to offset utility cost increases over the past eight years. Unfortunately, Memphis Light, Gas and

Water's rate increases will add an additional \$150,000 to our budgeted utility cost for the upcoming budget year. Maintaining the condition of our building is a significant ongoing investment. This past year we had 27 HVAC units replaced on the roof for a cost of \$714,000. We finished replacing all the flat sections on the roof of the main building, including those on the GRACE Building, this year. In addition, every year we have capital needs related to parking lot repairs, electronics replacement, and the need for additional equipment.

The construction of the 4th & 5th Grade and Middle School assembly rooms is underway. Even with a delay in completing structural work, demolition is nearly complete, and construction is in process.

Once again, we are glad to present a budget that is in line with our Pastor's heart to equip our members in prayer, evangelism, and discipleship and to love God, love people, share Jesus, and make disciples.

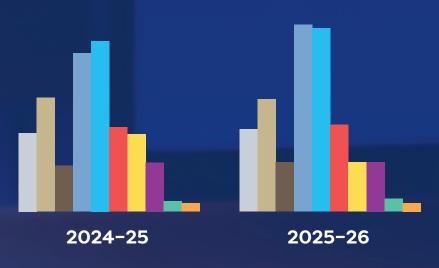

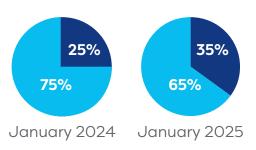
